Note re Campus Issue 18-19-01 “Approval of “Art Installation Parameters”

This campus issue is a continuation of a process from a previous campus issue. Campus Issue 14-15-02 “Art Installation of “The Four Directions” addressed the installation of a specific piece of art on the SCC Campus. The President’s response (made 12/18/15) to that issue did not include direct reference to the development of art parameters for the college. However, notes from that time show that the College President and VPA asked for information on feasibility parameters for art installations from the Campus Development Committee. The CD Committee reports that draft parameters for art installations were submitted to the College President at that time. Subsequently, the College President left, and Interim Presidents did not take additional action on the proposed art installation parameters.

Because no action was taken on the draft parameters, the Campus Development Committee submitted the current Campus Issue in December 2017. However, since the need for art parameters had been discussed with a previous college president, it was not clear that a new Campus Issue was needed. In June 2018, at a meeting with the College President, it was decided that the new Campus Issue would be submitted to the Executive Council.
