- ? Develops and publicizes scholarships, reviews student applications for eligibility, and selects recipients.
- ? Oversees and administers the Celebration of Excellence awards that recognize the contributions of classified professionals, faculty, and managers.
- ? Encourages campus-wide recognition and celebration of the service and leadership our retirees have given our campus.
- ? Reviews applications and administers student awards such as the Distinguished Service Award and other student recognition programs yet to be developed.
